14. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

As Martin County continues to grow and the arts continue to enrich community life, it is time for MartinArts to establish a larger, more comprehensive infrastructure; one that will incubate and support the arts so that organizations and artists can thrive and become self-sustaining. A \$19.8 million project will bring this historic building back to life as a new central arts hub that will assist our community attract and retain talent and builds a sense of place.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?



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It will be a backbone for the arts, supporting organizations, and individual artists to have access to a beautiful, centrally-located venue that is perfectly equipped for creating and sharing their art forms, in the visual, performing, and literary arts. Activities will include classes, performances, exhibitions, working artist studios, outdoor pop up markets, and events. Sharing this set of unduplicated facilities and functions will make all of the participants more financially viable and efficient. It will also provide many new opportunities for collaboration on bigger, better, and bolder presentations. Artists will be able to afford to be artists and organizations will be able to pay staff a sustaining wage. This campus will incubate financially sustainable arts organizations, allowing them to mature and grow.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The arts center at Stuart High School will be a place where students of all ages and all walks of life, both professionals and amateurs, can learn, create, exhibit, and enjoy. This arts campus will encourage them to explore new art forms, while keeping their spending in Martin County. Services will include visual, performing, and literary arts classes, events, and experiences.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The entire community benefits from a project like this, but specific programs will be designed to support/enhance the arts education of all Martin County school-aged children through STEAM education and a curriculum that is design to focus on the 4 C's of 21st Century Skills: Collaboration, Creativity, Critical Thinking, and Communication. The underserved residents of East Stuart will also benefit from easy access in one place for affordable extracurricular arts programs. Stuart Middle School, adjacent to the campus, could choose to become an arts magnet school. The outreach opportunities will be endless, especially given the proximity of the middle school and the Boys & Girls Club.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

This project has the potential to be a game-changer for downtown, leading the next evolution of the bustling Ocean Boulevard. With MartinArts as the "anchor tenant," the arts and culture corridor will be able to grow an additional half mile to the east. New restaurants, coffee shops, galleries, and more will have a logical place to thrive as MartinArts becomes a destination as well as a resource. That, in turn, will drive year-round local spending as well as cultural tourism spending. The expanded center will also help put Martin County on the map as a desirable business location for industries beyond hospitality. In addition to these benefits, this project will embrace adaptive reuse. The high school reflects the historic charm of Stuart. It is one of the few remaining buildings from the 1920s, possessing the unique character of old Florida.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

All state standards will be followed for contracts. Standard contract penalties are sufficient.
