The Sanibel Slough is the primary stormwater conveyance system for the island, with two separate drainage basins. The project will increase capacity and treatment for stormwater runoff, reduce storm-related flooding, and reduce high-nutrient discharges from the Sanibel Slough into San Carlos Bay, which was also identified as a "verified impaired" waterbody by FDEP in 2021.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Funding will be used for project design/engineering/permitting, and the construction phase will remove approximately 5,000 cubic yards of organic, nutrient-rich muck from the Slough, supporting the established TMDL and reducing nutrient-rich stormwater discharge from the Slough into San Carlos Bay (impaired).

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Increased capacity & treatment of stormwater runoff, and reduction of storm-related flooding in the Sanibel Slough.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Sanibel's general population will benefit from this project.
