14. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?



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Goal is to expand/rehab and construct the 66,503 sq.ft. facility from 232 beds to 122,249 sq.ft. 444 beds facility to safely accommodate increased adult & juvenile female/male prisoners & protect law enforcement/1st responders/employees/public. Funds used to seek contractual project management & construction services to fix old plumbing; add new inmate housing, safe intake & processing area; food service/laundry, medical areas and administration offices; emergency generator, demolition of existing pods and complete site work. A Committee was created to input/review proposals. A feasibility study was conducted and the County initiated consultant design services.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Activities include project management and construction services to complete the project as designed that includes but not limited to addressing the plumbing issues, demolishing existing structures, adding 55,746 sq.ft. that includes a 212 bed housing unit; a secure intake and processing area; laundry/food service areas; needed administration, medical space, emergency generator, ADA compliance, complete site work through the County's procurement policies and procedures.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Citizens are better served by improved facilities creating a safer, more secure, and positive environment that leads to less liability on the County and vicariously upon the tax payers. Environment encouraging the recovery and improvement of those incarcerated to increase the probability of becoming productive and contributing members of the community and reducing recidivism.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Population served is the residents and visitors of Okeechobee County that is designated as a Rural Area of Critical Economic Concern per Executive Order #11-81; and as outlined in F.S. 288.0656 Rural Economic Development Initiative (REDI) as a Rural Area of Opportunity; law enforcement personnel, first responders including the inmate population: Greater than 40,000 expected to be served.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Expected outcome is a fully renovated/constructed facility that provides appropriate and safe sheriff facilities and adequate jail accommodations to address increasing inmate populations and safely protect law enforcement personnel/visitors/citizenry; improve State revenues; increase workforce (13 jobs created). Improve mental/physical health, inmate education, protect general public from harm, reduce recidivism and substance abuse. Completion and certification of the project.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

Contractual milestones to be adhered to throughout the project; non-payment of invoices until milestones addressed; corrective action plan, liquidated damages, if needed.
