#### 4. Project/Program Description

he City of Plantation is seeking funds to renovate and harden (e.g. bring to current building code/windstorm standards) its Regional Utilities Operations Center (RUOC). The City provides water and wastewater treatment and distribution services for its nearly 100,000 residents. The RUOC was originally constructed in 1988, largely of glass. The building houses plant SCADA server & all communication wiring to the plant. Hardening of this facility will ensure uninterrupted water/wastewater service to the community and ensure a suitable Utilities EOC location that can withstand severe storm events.

Funds were used to defray City costs for PPE, public safety payrool, telework related costs, food distributions, etc. \$13,042,828 from ARPA, used for utility billing assistance, restoring capital cuts, stormwater master plan, and sewer lining.
