a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The build out of a local farmers market within the Northwest quadrant of Jacksonville. The purpose is to upgrade the infrastructure, create access to fresh food in a food insecure area, create a food center for wholesale and retail sale of local produce. We will also construct a resource center on site that includes a culinary training program, indoor vendor space, and business incubator program to support aspiring food and food related entrepreneurs.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?



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The improvements to the market will create desirable jobs, establish a productive green space, strengthen the local food

system, and create a visually pleasing community gathering space based on stakeholder input and needs. c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Access to fresh food, jobs, and economic opportunity.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target populations are elderly persons, persons with poor physical healthy, jobless persons, economically disadvantaged persons, at-risk youth, homeless, preschool students, grade school students, high school students and college students.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The improvements to the farmers market will result in an increased number of vendors, types of food, cultural/arts events, culinary training, learning garden education, and other activities which will then result in increased consumer traffic, increasing economic activity as well as tourism opportunities. The addition of a new educational on-site commercial kitchen designed to host the 8 week on-site culinary program will create jobs for those conducting the training as well as for those local residents living in poverty who take part in the training who want to move on to commercial kitchen employments through connections Feeding Northeast Florida has with restaurateurs. The foot traffic and economic impacts of the surrounding area will be tracked.
