14. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Construct a building/campus to house a mini-mall; business incubator; auditorium/live theater; computer lab; print shop; banks/credit unions; restaurants; boutiques; temporary and permanent business office space for doctors, lawyers, consultants, insurance agencies, government, faith and community-based organizations; classrooms; conference/meeting rooms; 24-hour daycare center; apartments/condos (3rd floor); entrepreneurial training, financial empowerment training, job-readiness, and life-skills training; various workshops and seminars; plus, expanded transportation options, etc. Currently, none of this exists on the east side. It will benefit the nation, not just Florida, Alachua County, and Gainesville. Will reduce economic disparity and provide a convenient location for residents and visitors to the area to access the provided services. The Green Acres Park in the Sweetwater Branch eco-system draws visitors from all over the world.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

After construction of the building, A diverse array of commercial and retail, educational, and cultural activities for residents as well as visitors to the area to include shopping, food, entertainment, recreation, festivals, and aesthetically beautiful outdoor space/park for fun, relaxation, and contemplation. It will also be a place for minority small businesses and micro-entrepreneurs to locate so that the buying public can have easy access to their goods and services and where the businesses themselves can have easy access to the technical support, training, and other resources needed to enhance their chances for long-term success.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The intent is to locate this facility within walking distance of thousands of residents of the east side of Gainesville; this is an environmentally friendly alternative to driving and a welcome option for those without cars or taxi or bus fare. Education options plus support in becoming profitably self-employed, training and technical support options; affordable child-care, affordable housing options; business library plus free staffed computer lab with high speed internet, Wi-Fi, and long operating hours; plus, stimulation of parental involvement in child's education through planned learning activities.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Primarily built to bolster the quality of life and self-esteem of the low to moderate-income local residents that primarily populate the area through a facility and related activities that attract interest in and money to the area. This includes the elderly, unemployed, youth at-risk, ex-offenders, and economically disadvantaged people of all ages, sexual orientation, and ethnicity.

This facility will create jobs and offer nearby goods, cultural activities, and services that currently do not exist in this area. It is the type of facility that also bolsters property values and garners the interest of other locales interested in bringing positive solutions to their communities in economic decline and residents that suffer from decades of racial and economic disparities.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

- -Create 100's of jobs to employ individuals with educational levels from GED to PhD.
- -Improve quality of education and life, to be measured by recording a baseline and measuring improvements in grades, household income, and standard of living.
- -Enrich cultural experiences, to be measured by recording a baseline and measuring the increase in number of residents who attend and/or participate in live theater and art shows.
- -Improve transportation options, to be measured by success in using the entrepreneurial training program to create small businesses that provide supplemental transportation services up to 24-hours a day/365 days a year to the transportation disadvantaged especially the elderly and those with medical or other challenges.
- -Increase economic activity, tourism, and economic self-sufficiency, as measured by number of new businesses created, improved revenues, profitability of vicinity micro-entrepreneurs, and tourism numbers reported by Gainesville.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

Standard contract penalties are sufficient.
