4. Project/Program Description

In order to appropriately sustain special needs residents at special needs shelters, these shelter sites must have a backup electrical service. Pinellas County is seeking funding to support the purchase and installation of three generators, one each for two new special needs shelter locations and one to replace an existing obsolete, under powered, 20-year-old generator at a third shelter location. In coordination with the Florida Department of Health – Pinellas and the Pinellas County School Board, Pinellas County will properly assess and configure each generator to maintain electrical service for: electrical outlets for durable medical equipment, the HVAC system, emergency lighting and cooking facilities at each school. It is estimated that we will need 720 kw generators or larger to accomplish this.

Pinellas is requesting \$3,750,000 for this project; this includes the cost of the generators and installation.

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Pinellas County currently has over 5,000 registrants in their Special Needs program and is required to provide supportive services to those with medical needs during evacuations. The 2016 National Hurricane Center update to the Sea Lake and Overland Surges from Hurricanes (SLOSH) Model increased the Pinellas County areas threatened by storm surge to include two of our three identified Special Needs Shelters. Oak Grove Middle and Dunedin Highland Middle schools cannot be used for all hurricane evacuation scenarios. The need is to have Pinellas shelters outside of all storm surge areas. With the threat of rapid intensifying storms, as seen in 2022, the placement of suitable resilient facilities outside of storm surge areas is critical.

This project will allow Pinellas County and our special needs sheltering partners the ability to plan, maintain and train and 3 stable shelter locations.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Each generator will maintain electrical service during power outages at the special needs shelters for electrical outlets for durable medical equipment, the HVAC system, emergency lighting and cooking facilities at each school.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Pinellas residents will have 3 special need shelters that are mitigated for power outages that will provide life sustaining electrical services for durable medical equipment , lighting, HVAC and cooking facilities at each shelter location.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Pinellas' most vulnerable population is the target population. Pinellas County currently has over 5,000 registrants in our Special Needs program and is required to provide supportive services to those with medical needs during evacuations.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Pinellas County will have the ability to provide risk sheltering for over 2,400 at risk residents on life sustaining medical equipment during hurricanes and tropical events with wide spread and prolonged power outages. The proposed capital outlay performance results will tested through training and activation of these shelters during mandatory evacuation events.

Pinellas would reimburse the State for the obligated funds.
