Western Indiantown Road Improvement (Jupiter West Plaza to Chasewood Plaza) - Jupiter

4. Project/Program Description

Indiantown Road is one of the busiest roadways in Palm Beach County. The road is regularly congested and saturated with traffic. The Town recently contributed funds to a separate Florida Department of Transportation project in order to improve the traffic conditions. This project would act as a future improvement and next phase to extend the proposed lanes. This project would install a westbound auxiliary lane from Central Boulevard to the intersection at Jupiter West Plaza and an eastbound auxiliary lane from Central Boulevard to intersection at Chasewood Plaza. These improvements will allow traffic to more easily clear Jupiter's entrance limits which lead to I-95 and the Turnpike. Due to geographic restrictions, there are limited ways to access lower Martin County so that contributes to the need for easy traffic flow in and out of Jupiter.

To alleviate traffic along one of the busiest roadways within Palm Beach County and improve traffic conditions for motorists commuting along Indiantown Road.

Roadway and transportation improvements.

Improved traffic conditions along the main arterial roadway leading into Jupiter.

All individuals that commute into and through Jupiter on a daily basis. The estimated amount is approximately 100,000.

**e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?**

Improve traffic conditions on one of the busiest roads in Palm Beach County. Assist motorists entering and exiting Jupiter at the point of entry from I-95 and the Turnpike. Traffic studies will be performed to show the improvement of traffic flow after the project is completed.

**f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?**

If the contractor for the construction were unable to fulfill their contractual duties then liquidated damages should be charged to the contractor against the balance of the contract. Should deliverables not be met, an appropriate penalty would be loss of grant funding.
