The funding will support developing and implementing a new program which will focus on single fathers or fathers who may not be the primary caregiver of their children. The program will match fathers with volunteers (Dadvocates) who will focus on mentorship, support, and education through individual and group peer interactions. The overall goal is to support a father in being an engaged, active, and nurturing parent, thus reducing the likelihood a child will experience adverse effects.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The Children's Advocacy Center currently provides an evidence based parenting program. This funding will enhance the program in providing mentorship, educational activities and long term support. Services will be provided to Dads to include educational curriculum, (ie. coparenting, single parenting, financial literacy, etc.) along with activities with their children.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Program staff will recruit, screen, and train volunteers. Dads will be matched with a mentor (Dadvocate). Educational programs/curriculum will be implemented and meetings/activities scheduled throughout the year. Dads will participate in activities/classes, peer support; their children will be involved in activities as well.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

51-100 individuals will be served including economically disadvantaged persons, at risk youth, children K-12,

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Improvement of mental health, enrich cultural experience, improve quality of education, protecting the general public and enhancing economic efficiency are all expected benefits as described below.

Provide classes and activities to Dads and their children such as yoga, mindfulness, meditation.

Offer classes and events to Dads and their children that allow them to experience other cultures, arts, etc.

Assist Dads in being more engaged with their children's school, communicating with teachers, completing homework, and extracurricular activities.

Breaking the cycle of abuse/preventing abuse by assisting Dads with coping skills, appropriate discipline, etc.

Linking Dads to appropriate resources (employment, etc.) and providing classes on financial literacy.
