The FMT serves adults who are charged with "lesser" felony offenses without a significant history of violence. Adapted from the Florida Assertive Community Treatment (FACT) team model, an FMT is a self-contained team which directly provides or coordinates treatment, rehabilitation and support services for persons with serious and persistent mental illness. Services include crisis intervention, mental health screening and assessment, case management, psychiatric evaluation and medication management, substance use treatment, and in-home or on-site treatment. Although multiple FMTs operate in the state, no team has existed in Northwest Florida prior to the establishment of the present FMT in FY 2022-23.

Life Management Center's Forensic Multidisciplinary Team (FMT) is a 24-hour a day, 7 days per week service to divert commitment of individuals from state mental health treatment facilities. FMT serves adults who are charged with "lesser" felony offenses without a significant history of violence. Diversion from criminal justice system and jail is also the goal. FMT is adapted from the Florida Assertive Community Treatment model. Multiple FMTs are established in other areas of the state, but no other teams existed in Northwest Florida prior to the funding of this FMT in FY 2022-23.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Services are community-based activities provided to an individual prior to, or in lieu of, commitment to a State forensic mental health treatment facility. Post commitment diversion services are also provided for adults who are charged with a felony offense and determined to be incompetent to proceed or not guilty by reason of insanity.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The Forensic Multidisciplinary Team (FMT) is a self-contained team which directly provides or coordinates treatment, rehabilitation and support services for persons with serious and persistent mental illness. Services include crisis intervention, mental health screening and assessment, case management, psychiatric evaluation and medication management, substance use treatment, and in-home or on-site treatment services.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target population to be served by the Life Management Center's Forensic Multidisciplinary Team (FMT) is persons with poor mental health, economically disadvantaged persons, homeless, and mentally ill adults charged with minor felony offenses without significant histories of violence. The team is expected to serve between 51-100 individuals annually.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The expected benefit or outcome of this project is improved mental health, protection of the general public from harm, and reduced recidivism. This will be measured by addressing and treating co-occurring mental health and substance use disorders, reducing psychiatric hospitalization, and increasing days in the community by facilitating and encouraging stable living. Outcomes will be measured by maintaining data on persons served annually, including the number of days served, and diverting adults from incarceration in the criminal justice system.
