FSCJ received \$58,458,981 of Federal CARES Act funds (Institutional Allocation). These funds were used for campus safety and sanitation, revenue recovery, student debt write-offs, technology upgrades and software to support distance learning, and employee training programs. FSCJ received \$41,868,938 of CARES, CRRSAA, and ARP funds(Financial Aid Allocation). These funds were distributed directly to students as financial aid.

#### 14. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Relocation of the Career Connection Center at the Downtown FSCJ Campus to be in closer proximity to other student services. Funding will be utilized for design and construction of the new Career Connection Center. The new location will expand student support services, like internship and job placements, advisory services, and the Career Closet Boutique.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Funding will allow for the relocation and expansion of the Career Connection Center located at FSCJ's Downtown Campus. Funding will be utilized for the planning, design, and construction to expand and renovate the Career Connection Center space, thereby expanding the services and increasing the number of students served.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Career Development staff located within the new Career Connection Center will provide the following services and resources to students: individual career and internship counseling, career assessments, career resource library, occupational research assistance, matching major and career options, resume and cover letter writing assistance, workshops, and a Career Closet Boutique.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target population is FSCJ students, including those who are jobless or economically disadvantaged.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The relocation and expansion of the Career Connection Center at FSCJ will enhance student's economic self sufficiency by providing assistance and resources to career opportunities. The Center will also improve economic activity by increasing the number of students and graduates that will be connected to job opportunities within the Jacksonville area, therefore adding to the local workforce. These benefits will be measured by the increase in students and graduates that utilize the Career Connection Center services to be placed within an internship program or accept a job and enter the workforce.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

If the College does not move forward with the project, or complete the project, funds will be reverted back to the agency.
