a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?



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The expansion would enlarge the auditorium. The room could be divided into three breakout rooms as well, providing flexibility and multiple meetings at the same time.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The construction of the UF/IFAS Southwest Florida Research and Education Center (REC) expansion will allow the REC to host more local residents, growers, and graduate students allowing for increased participation in research and education roles of the facility. It will also increase the availability of online education courses for students.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Expand availability of space and opportunity for education on the latest in science and technology as well as issues affecting the agriculture industry.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Southwest Florida Agricultural and related industries generate over 122,000 jobs in surrounding Collier County, Lee, Charlotte, Hendry, & Glades counties.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The expansion would enable events to be expanded from 100 to 160 persons in the auditorium, allowing for increased participation in research and education roles of the facility. Currently, there are graduate 18 students at the center and the additional space and equipment would expand their access to online learning.
