a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The 1619Fest Orlando Black History Month Celebration is a dynamic event that has occurred every Black History Month in Central Florida since February 16, 2020. As stipulated by public law H.R. 1242, 1619Fest encourages and organizes activities during Black History Month and throughout the year to expand understanding and appreciation of the recognition of 400-years of African American history.

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b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The 1619 Fest Orlando is a celebration of arts and culture from Africans in the Diaspora. The SOKO Marketplace is a weekly community marketplace that provides a designated venue for entrepreneurs and artisans of color to exchange goods and services. Rebel Run is a historical 5K commemorating Hannibal Barca, the namesake for Winter Park's Hannibal Square since 1881, that promotes health and wellness. Funds will also be allocated to a community garden to help provide healthy food options.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The 1619Fest Orlando will help boost the economy that directly affects the minority area and, more specifically, the Hannibal Square economic opportunity zone, the CRA (Community Redevelopment Agency) of the City of Winter Park. It will help bridge the community timeline of Hannibal Square's creation, assisting residents and visitors in developing a more comprehensive understanding of American history year-round.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

This event expects to serve over 1,000 community members, including students from grade school to university-level alongside at-risk youth, small businesses, persons with poor physical health, the elderly, and the economically disadvantaged.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The benefits of this project are historic preservation, community stabilization, and cultural arts enrichment which is measured by improved small business sustainability, increased health and wellness, and deepened historical understanding through community connections.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?
