## HB 7067 (3R) by the Committee on Judiciary Committee, Representative Jacques and others—

**Pretrial Detention Hearings**; Authorizes court to base an order of pretrial detention solely on hearsay. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

Substituted for SB 7068(SUB) (Bradley), read the second time, and amended on March 5, 2024

## CS/HB 347 (3R) by the Committee on Judiciary Committee and Representative Truenow—

**Exemptions from Products Liability Actions;** Specifies circumstances under which products liability actions may not be brought against agricultural employers, distributors, dealers, or applicators. Effective Date: 07/01/2024

Read the second time on March 5, 2024

## HB 1451 (3R) by Representatives Michael, Jacques and others—

**Identification Documents**; Prohibits counties & municipalities, respectively, from accepting certain ID cards or documents that are knowingly issued to individuals who are not lawfully present in United States as form of identification; provides exception. Effective Date: 07/01/2024

Substituted for **SB 1174(SUB)** (Ingoglia) and read the second time on March 5, 2024

## SB 7070 (SO) by the Appropriations Committee on Health and Human Services (Harrell)—

Sickle Cell Disease Research and Treatment Education; Creating the Sickle Cell Disease Research and Treatment Grant Program within the Department of Health; requiring the Office of Minority Health and Health Equity within the department to use funds appropriated to the program to award grants to community-based sickle cell disease medical treatment and research centers operating in this state; revising sickle cell disease and sickle cell trait screening requirements, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2024

Reported favorably by the Committee on Appropriations

#### CS/SB 396 (SO) by the Committee on Education Pre-K -12, Senator Berman and others—

Holocaust Remembrance Day; Requiring the Governor to annually proclaim a specified day as "Holocaust Remembrance Day"; authorizing "Holocaust Remembrance Day" to be observed in this state's public schools and be observed by public exercise as the Governor may designate, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2024

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Education Pre-K -12; and the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably

# CS/SB 408 (SO) by the Appropriations Committee on Transportation, Tourism, and Economic Development, Senator Burgess and others—

Florida Veterans' History Program; Defining the term "veteran"; creating the Florida Veterans' History Program within the Division of Arts and Culture of the Department of State as a Florida Folklife Program; requiring the division's folklorists to seek out and identify certain veterans; authorizing the division to contract with a third-party vendor for a specified purpose, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2024

Reported favorably by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Appropriations Committee on Transportation, Tourism, and Economic Development; and the Committee on Appropriations reports the committee substitute favorably

Compare to CS/CS/HB 1329(HC) in the Committee on Fiscal Policy

#### SB 590 (SO) by Senator Burgess and others—

Music-based Supplemental Content to Accelerate Learner Engagement and Success Pilot Program; Creating the pilot program within the Department of Education; providing requirements for the pilot program; providing funding requirements, subject to legislative appropriation; requiring the College of Education at the University of Florida to evaluate the pilot program's effectiveness and annually share its findings with the Department of Education and the Legislature, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2024

Reported favorably by the Committee on Education Pre-K -12; reported favorably by the Appropriations Committee on Education; and reported favorably by the Committee on Fiscal Policy

Compare to CS/CS/HB 537(HC) in the Committee on Fiscal Policy

## CS/SB 814 (SO) by the Committee on Rules and Senator Yarborough—

Real Property Ownership; Revising the definition of the term "foreign principal"; revising the ownership interest that a foreign principal may have in agricultural land; requiring certain foreign principals to register the ownership of a controlling interest in agricultural land owned before a certain date; authorizing criminal penalties for certain sales and purchases of controlling interests in agricultural land; revising the ownership interest that a foreign principal may have in real property on or near military installations or critical infrastructure facilities, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

Reported favorably by the Committee on Judiciary; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Rules

## CS/CS/SB 888 (SO) by the Committees on Rules, Criminal Justice, Senator Perry and others—

Property Rights; Authorizing property owners or their authorized agents to request assistance from the sheriff from where the property is located for the immediate removal of unauthorized occupants from a residential dwelling under certain conditions; authorizing a sheriff to arrest an unauthorized occupant for legal cause; providing criminal penalties for any person who knowingly and willfully presents a false document purporting to be a valid lease agreement, deed, or other instrument conveying real property rights, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2024

Reported favorably by the Committee on Judiciary; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Criminal Justice; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Rules

Similar to CS/CS/HB 621(HC) in the Committee on Rules

#### CS/CS/CS/SB 966 (SO) by the Committees on Rules, Commerce and Tourism, Banking and Insurance and Senator Burgess—

**Builder Warranties**; Requiring a builder to provide certain warranties for a newly constructed home for a specified period; requiring the builder to comply with the warranty requirement even if the newly constructed home is sold or transferred; requiring the builder to remedy at the builder's expense certain defects and work damaged; requiring the builder to restore any work damaged in certain circumstances, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2024

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Banking and Insurance; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Commerce and Tourism; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Rules

## CS/SB 1044 (SO) by the Committee on Education Pre-K -12 and Senator Grall—

**School Chaplains**; Authorizing school districts and charter schools to adopt a policy to allow volunteer school chaplains; requiring district school boards and charter school governing boards to assign specified duties to such volunteer school chaplains; requiring school districts that adopt volunteer school chaplain policies to publish certain information on their websites; providing background screening requirements for volunteer school chaplains, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2024

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Education Pre-K -12; the Appropriations Committee on Education reports the committee substitute favorably; and the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably

#### CS/CS/SB 1366 (SO) by the Committees on Appropriations, Banking and Insurance, Senator DiCeglie and others—

**My Safe Florida Condominium Pilot Program**; Establishing the My Safe Florida Condominium Pilot Program within the Department of Financial Services; providing requirements for associations to apply for a certain inspection; authorizing a unit owner to participate in the pilot program under certain circumstances; providing requirements for hurricane mitigation inspectors and inspections, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2024

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Banking and Insurance; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Appropriations

Similar to CS/CS/CS/HB 1029(HC) in the Committee on Appropriations

## CS/SB 1154 (SO) by the Committee on Criminal Justice and Senator Simon—

**Probation and Community Control Violations**; Revising the sentencing score sheet to reflect the absence of community sanction points assessed in certain circumstances; revising sanctions for probation violations; providing for hearings within a specified time period for low-risk probation or community control violations; providing for the release of offenders in certain circumstances if a hearing is not held, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2024

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Criminal Justice; the Appropriations Committee on Criminal and Civil Justice reports the committee substitute favorably; and the Committee on Fiscal Policy reports the committee substitute favorably

# CS/CS/CS/SB 1178 (SO) by the Committee on Fiscal Policy, the Appropriations Committee on Agriculture, Environment, and General Government, the Committee on Regulated Industries, Senator Bradley and others—

Community Associations; Requiring community associations to return official records of an association within a specified period following termination of a contract; requiring community association managers and management firms to provide a written disclosure of certain conflicts of interest to the association's board; providing criminal penalties for any officer, director, or manager of an association who knowingly solicits, offers to accept, or accepts a kickback; authorizing, rather than requiring, certain hurricane protection specifications; specifying when the cost of installation of hurricane protection is not a common expense, etc. Effective Date: Except as otherwise expressly provided in this act, this act shall take effect July 1, 2024

Department of Transportation; Revising the list of areas of program responsibility within the Department of Transportation; requiring that a specified amount of recurring funds from the State Transportation Trust Fund be made available for the Intermodal Logistics Center Infrastructure Support Program; revising provisions relating to the department's mission, goals, and objectives; requiring governmental entities that propose certain projects to conduct a traffic study; revising the length of time before which an inactive prepaid toll account becomes unclaimed property, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2024

## CS/SB 1256 (SO) by the Committee on Fiscal Policy and Senator Martin—

Voter Registration Applications; Providing an exception to a requirement that certain voter registration applicants must be registered without party affiliation; requiring the Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles to notify certain individuals of certain information; requiring the department to ensure that information technology processes and updates do not alter certain information without written consent, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

Reported favorably by the Committee on Ethics and Elections; reported favorably by the Appropriations Committee on Transportation, Tourism, and Economic Development; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Fiscal Policy

# CS/SB 1360 (SO) by the Appropriations Committee on Agriculture, Environment, and General Government and Senator Gruters—

Florida Red Tide Mitigation and Technology Development Initiative; Requiring the initiative to develop recommendations for deployment of certain technologies and approaches and submit a report to the Department of Environmental Protection, the Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission, the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services, and certain state agencies; requiring the department to submit an evaluation regarding the technologies and approaches to Mote Marine Laboratory within a specified time period and amend regulatory or permitting processes and expedite regulatory reviews under certain circumstances, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2024

Reported favorably by the Committee on Environment and Natural Resources; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Appropriations Committee on Agriculture, Environment, and General Government; and the Committee on Fiscal Policy reports the committee substitute favorably

Identical to CS/CS/HB 1565(HC) in the Committee on Fiscal Policy

#### CS/CS/HB 49 (SO) by the Committees on Local Administration, Federal Affairs & Special Districts Subcommittee, Regulatory Reform & Economic Development Subcommittee, Representative Chaney and others—

Employment and Curfew of Minors; Revises certain employment restrictions for minors 16 & 17 years of age; revises age at which employment restrictions apply; requires curfew adopted by county or municipal ordinance to include certain exceptions. Effective Date: 07/01/2024

the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably, with one amendment

# CS/HB 1317 (SO) by the Committee on Choice & Innovation Subcommittee, Representative Duggan and others—

Patriotic Organizations; Authorizes school districts to allow representatives of patriotic organizations certain opportunities to speak to students, distribute certain materials, & provide certain displays relating to patriotic organizations; requires certain school districts to provide date & time for such patriotic organizations to speak with students, distribute materials, & provide certain displays; authorizes patriotic organizations to be provided certain access to school buildings & properties. Effective Date: 07/01/2024

the Committee on Fiscal Policy reports the committee substitute favorably, with one amendment

#### CS/HJR 7017 (SO) by the Committees on State Affairs Committee, Ways & Means Committee, Representative Buchanan and others—

Annual Adjustment to Homestead Exemption Value; Proposes amendment to State Constitution to require an annual adjustment for inflation to the value of current or future homestead exemptions that apply solely to levies other than school district levies & for which every person who has legal or equitable title to real estate and maintains thereon the permanent residence of the owner, or another person legally or naturally dependent upon the owner is eligible.

the Committee on Appropriations reports the committee substitute favorably

# CS/HB 7019 (SO) by the Committees on State Affairs Committee, Ways & Means Committee, Representative Buchanan and others—

**Exemption of Homesteads**; Requires value of homestead exemption be adjusted annually; requiring Legislature appropriate funds for specified purpose; require funds be distributed in specified manner; requires specified counties provide certain documentation. Effective Date: On the effective date of the amendment to the State Constitution proposed by HJR 7017 or a similar joint resolution having substantially the same specific intent and purpose

## CS/CS/SB 1716 (SO) by the Committees on Fiscal Policy, Banking and Insurance and Senator Boyd—

Citizens Property Insurance Corporation; Revising a requirement for certain flood insurance; providing that certain structures located within certain zip codes are eligible for coverage from the corporation; providing that certain accounts for Citizens Property Insurance Corporation revenues, assets, liabilities, losses, and expenses are now maintained as the Citizens account; deleting provisions relating to surcharges and regular assessments upon determination of projected deficits; providing that certain personal lines residential risks are not eligible for any policy issued by the corporation, etc. Effective Date: Except as otherwise expressly provided in this act and except for this section, which shall take effect upon becoming a law, this act shall take effect July 1, 2024

## CS/SB 1784 (SO) by the Committee on Fiscal Policy and Senator Grall—

Mental Health and Substance Abuse; Providing an exception to background screening requirements for certain licensed physicians and nurses; authorizing the state to establish that a transfer evaluation was performed by providing the court with a copy of the evaluation before the close of the state's case-in-chief; allowing a patient's legal custodian to authorize release of the patient's clinical records; revising requirements for ordering a person for involuntary services and treatment, petitions for involuntary service, appointment of counsel, and continuances of hearings, respectively, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2024

Reported favorably by the Committee on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Fiscal Policy

Similar to CS/CS/HB 7021, 1st Eng.(HC) in the Committee on Fiscal Policy

## SB 7048 (SO) by the Committee on Education Pre-K - 12 (Simon)—

Education; Expanding the credit contributions for eligible nonprofit scholarship-funding organizations; revising eligibility requirements for the Family Empowerment Scholarship Program; revising eligibility requirements for the Florida Tax Credit Scholarship Program; revising requirements for the Hope Scholarship Program; requiring the Florida Center for Students with Unique Abilities to develop specified purchasing guidelines by a specified date and annually revise such guidelines, etc. Effective Date: Except as otherwise expressly provided in this act and except for this section, which shall take effect upon this act becoming a law, this act shall take effect July 1, 2024

Reported favorably by the Committee on Appropriations

Identical to CS/CS/HB 1403(HC) in the Committee on Appropriations

# CS/SB 7052 (SO) by the Committees on Fiscal Policy, and Children, Families, and Elder Affairs (Garcia)—

Economic Self-sufficiency; Providing that a participant has good cause for noncompliance with work requirements for a specified time period under certain circumstances; providing requirements for staff members of local workforce development boards when interviewing participants; requiring benefit management and career planning using a specified tool as part of the state's one-stop delivery system; requiring the Department of Commerce to develop certain training; authorizing certain participants to participate in certain programs or courses for a specified number of hours per week, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2024

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Fiscal Policy

Identical to CS/CS/HB 1267, 1st Eng.(HC) in the Committee on Fiscal Policy

## CS/SB 1372 (SO) by the Appropriations Committee on Education, Senator Ingoglia and others—

Educator Preparation Programs; Prohibiting the courses and curricula of teacher preparation programs, postsecondary educator preparation institutes, professional learning certification programs, and school leader preparation programs, respectively, from distorting certain events and including certain curriculum and instruction; requiring teacher preparation programs, postsecondary educator preparation institutes, professional learning certification programs, and school leader preparation programs to afford candidates certain opportunities, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2024

Reported favorably by the Committee on Education Postsecondary; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Appropriations Committee on Education; and the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably

Identical to CS/HB 1291(HC) in the Committee on Rules

## CS/SB 1464 (SO) by the Committee on Fiscal Policy and Senator Calatayud—

Traffic Enforcement; Prohibiting contracts awarded by certain entities outside this state from being used to procure contracts with manufacturers or vendors of camera systems used for traffic enforcement; prohibiting a governmental entity from knowingly entering into or renewing certain contracts for camera systems used for traffic enforcement; requiring certain counties or municipalities to enact an ordinance to authorize placement or installation of traffic infraction detectors, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2024

Reported favorably by the Committee on Transportation; reported favorably by the Appropriations Committee on Transportation, Tourism, and Economic Development; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Fiscal Policy

Identical to CS/CS/HB 1363(HC) in the Committee on Fiscal Policy

#### CS/CS/CS/SB 1470 (SO) by the Committee on Appropriations, the Appropriations Committee on Criminal and Civil Justice, the Committee on Judiciary, Senator Hutson and others—

Clerks of Court; Revising the fund into which moneys recovered by certain state attorneys must be deposited; revising the fund into which certain payments received must be deposited as related to public defenders or criminal conflict and civil regional counsels; revising the fund into which certain filing fees are to be deposited; deleting a provision requiring each state attorney to publish an annual report addressing results of his or her affirmative action program; revising the distribution of certain administrative fees, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Judiciary; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Appropriations Committee on Criminal and Civil Justice; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Appropriations

Similar to CS/CS/HB 1077, 1st Eng.(HC) in the Committee on Appropriations

#### CS/SB 1528 (SO) by the Committee on Transportation and Senator Collins—

Violations Against Vulnerable Road Users; Designating the "Vulnerable Road User Act"; requiring a person who commits a moving violation that causes serious bodily injury to or the death of a vulnerable road user to pay specified fines and attend a specified driver improvement course; requiring the court to revoke the person's driver license for a specified period; defining the term "vulnerable road user", etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2024

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Transportation; and the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably

Compare to **CS/CS/HB 1133(HC)** in the Committee on Fiscal Policy

## CS/SB 1640 (SO) by the Committee on Fiscal Policy and Senator Collins—

Payments for Health Care Services; Establishing a 3-year statute of limitations for an action to collect medical debt for services rendered by certain health care facilities; providing additional personal property exemptions from legal process for medical debts resulting from services provided in certain licensed facilities; requiring certain licensed facilities to post on their respective websites a consumer-friendly list of standard charges for a minimum number of shoppable health care services, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2024

Reported favorably by the Committee on Banking and Insurance; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Fiscal Policy

Similar to HB 7089, 1st Eng.(HC) in the Committee on Fiscal Policy

# CS/CS/CS/SB 684 (SO) by the Committees on Rules, Fiscal Policy, Community Affairs and Senator DiCeglie—

Residential Building Permits; Requiring the Florida Building Commission to modify a specific provision of the Florida Building Code to state that sealed drawings by a design professional are not required for replacement and installation of certain construction; removing provisions relating to acquiring building permits for certain residential dwellings; revising the timeframes for approving, approving with conditions, or denying certain building permits; authorizing local governments to use certain fees for certain technology upgrades, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2024

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Community Affairs; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Fiscal Policy; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Rules

Similar to CS/CS/CS/HB 267, 1st Eng.(HC) in the Committee on Rules
