HF was founded in 1984 as a 501c3 nonprofit focused on providing scholarships for addiction treatment and groundbreaking substance use prevention programs. Today, HF combats substance use by raising awareness and providing quality prevention education programming in schools and communities in 35 Florida counties, as well as educating medical and other professionals.

- 14. Program Performance
 - a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?



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Individuals and their families with substance use disorder (SUD) histories need access to resources beyond clinical stabilization and associated treatment, such as linkages to social recovery supports, volunteerism/employment, and educational resources (especially in the case of MAT). Participation with these support services is associated positively with recovery capital and quality of life, and decreased levels of psychological distress/relapse. Additionally, professionals and paraprofessionals need to understand how to identify and respond to a person presenting with a substance abuse disorder.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The new Center will serve as an anchor destination for the local and state-wide recovery community providing space for a youth APG, support meetings, recovery-focused educational events/conferences, recovery resources, as well as the headquarters for prevention education work. The goal is the provision of broader psychosocial supports, including personal, social, environmental, and cultural resources, which many find necessary for sustaining long term recovery.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Hanley Foundation is focused on filling a void that led to Palm Beach County being declared the "epicenter" of the opiate epidemic. A strong recovery community within Palm Beach County will help to support individuals in recovery by providing access to meetings, programs, and services, as well as opportunities to get to know like-minded people in recovery. This access point will be the new Hanley Foundation Recovery Community Center.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Professionals, paraprofessionals, middle school students, high school students, university/college students, at-risk youth, jobless persons, economically disadvantaged persons, homeless, drug users (in health services), currently or formerly incarcerated persons, drug offenders (in criminal justice services), victims of crime, and family members of addicted persons.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Programming will reduce the number of individuals diagnosed with substance use disorder, a leading cause of accidental death, hospitalization, and illness statewide. Evaluation of drug usage, drug-related death/illness for Palm Beach County and surrounding areas, as provided annually by the FDOH. The building will provide space to house programs, groups, and community-based meetings. The number of individuals and families engaged in support services offered by the agency will ensure that needs are being addressed. Evidence-based prevention education for middle and high school students will seek to reduce first age of use in terms of alcohol, marijuana, and other substances. Students will show proficiency in understanding the harmful effects of alcohol, marijuana, and other substances, therefore delaying (or eliminating) potential usage. Individuals entering recovery will be connected to vocational training to re-enter the workforce. Number of individuals participating in programming.
