14. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The project will provide a severely needed pressure increase to the potable water system of US 92, which serves a host of public facilities, as well as accompanying upgrades to the sanitary sewer system. Currently underserved public facilities include: Tomoka Correctional Institution, Volusia County Jail, School District Facilities Maintenance Facility, and Volusia County Sheriff's Operations. The loop infrastructure will provide system redundancy as well as accommodate future growth.

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b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Funds will be used to enhance existing water supply main to public facilities as well as add another side for a loop system, increasing the water supply and adding redundancy. Enhanced and new sanitary sewer system will be added along the loop to provide additional capacity for the upgraded system as well as future development.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Increased potable water to the public buildings as well as fire service water to the buildings. Increased sewer capacity and service.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Public employees, including Volusia Corrections, School District, and Sheriff officers and employees as well as incarcerated persons at the facilities and general citizens who go to the facilities.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Increase water pressure and redundancy for the public buildings. Water pressure can be measured directly; redundancy and efficiency can be determined through reduced outage time.
