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Columbia County received \$2,000,000 in CARES Act Funding that was allocated towards the NFMIP WWTP to shore up an existing grant. \$13.9 million of ARPA money was divided up as follows: \$6.2 million for Fort White water projects; \$4 million for the NFMIP WWTP; 1.7 million in business assistance; 679k for individual assistance; and \$1 million for emergency home repair. An additional \$729,853 came from the LCTPA portion of funding that is uncommitted.
