4. Project/Program Description

Wakulla County (County) seeks funds for contractual engineering/design, site work and construction services to build a 4,270 sq. ft. fire rescue facility on Wakulla County owned property (purchased for \$25,000) on Shell Point Road just south of US Highway 98 elevated to eliminate the risk of flooding due to sea level rise/natural disasters and storm events. Once built this local facility will provide optimum coverage, improved response times and reliable emergency services to serve visitors, citizens, residents and the business community in this area of the County. Project protects life, health, safety and property; Improve/maintain ISO rating; addresses the Public Safety Plan, Local Mitigation Strategy and the Adopted Infrastructure Plan. County is designated as a Rural Area of Opportunity.

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?



Goal is to protect and save lives and property. Funds are for contractual engineering/design, site work and construction of a 4,270 sq. ft. fire rescue station on Wakulla County owned property on Shell Point Road south of US 98 elevated to withstand flooding/ sea level rise. Provide residents/citizens/business community with optimum coverage & improved emergency services & response times. Maintain/improve ISO rating. Addresses Public Safety Master Plan, Local Mitigation Strategy and Adopted Infrastructure Plan.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Seek contractual engineering/design, site work, and construction services through Wakulla County's procurement process to build a 4,270 sq. ft. fire rescue facility located off Shell Point Road just south of US 98. New Station design includes 2 bays, kitchen, and sleeping quarters built at higher elevation to eliminate risk of coastal flooding during natural disasters/sea level rise/severe storms.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Direct services to citizens is to provide reliable fire rescue emergency services in a nearby fully staffed local facility from which to provide efficient fire, rescue, emergency services in order to protect life, health, safety and property of citizenry, residents and the business community; cost savings through improved insurance ratings in this Rural Area of Opportunity.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The new fire rescue facility will serve Wakulla County residents, visitors and the business community in the Shell Point/US 98 areas. Greater than 37,000 individuals.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will

be measured?

Once constructed the new facility will provide for substantially improved fire rescue services with improved response times, optimum coverage and have the ability to offer additional emergency services in the event of a disaster. Benefit is protection of life, health, safety of citizenry, visitors, business community and property. Maintain/improve ISO rating, reduce insurance costs with nearby/local emergency fire rescue services in this Rural Area of Opportunity. Addresses the Public Safety Plan, Local Mitigation Strategy and the Adopted Infrastructure Plan. Completion and certification of the project,
