a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Back packs and school supplies will be distributed to over 9,000 children in South Florida; 250+ under-served children will participate in free sports leagues and clinics multiple times annually; free SAT/ACT Prep Courses to 25+ high school students; computers and/or laptops will be awarded to families and students that otherwise cannot afford one; and more educational opportunities.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

School supplies, back packs, and uniforms will be purchased and distributed. Over 25 prep courses will be prepaid to offer to students that otherwise cannot pay for one. Computers or laptops will be purchased and awarded to families or students. Uniforms, basketballs, supplies, awards, refreshments, referees, etc. will be purchased and paid in order to have a successful basketball league/clinic and be able to offer to over 250+ children.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Over 9,000 children will receive school supplies; 250+ children will learn to play basketball and be part of a team; high school students who need help preparing for SAT/ACT will be given the opportunity to take a prep course for free; computers or laptops will be awarded to families that cannot afford one; other learning opportunities can be created at no cost to families and children.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

We target low income families and communities and student population eligible for free/reduced lunch and serve over 9,000 children annually.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Students are benefiting from receiving the tools they need for their academic school year in order to be prepared while in school; students are either learning skills in a sport or given an opportunity to practice what they have learned while participating in a team; students are taking a prep course that will improve their scores for acceptance to college; all giving students a path for success and a road to higher education. Students given these tools and opportunities advance academically with completion of high school and apply to college and/or universities.
