This project will protect against sewer spills, replace an old at-risk force main, extend the life of the system, and will complete the final phase replacement of the entire force main from Pasadena lift station.

Replace approximately 5,800 linear feet of at-risk 36" sewer force main pre-stressed concrete cylinder pipe installed in 1979. The force main serves multiple municipalities including St. Pete Beach, Treasure Island, South Pasadena, St. Petersburg, and Pinellas County. This project will protect against sewer spills, replace an old at-risk force main, extend the life of the system, and will complete the final phase replacement of the entire force main from Pasadena lift station.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?



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Construction services will be provided to complete to the project of for the residents of the municipalities it serves.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The services provided by the will include sewer maintenance and wastewater treatment that is needed daily by the community.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target populations is the residents of several municipalities including St. Pete Beach, Treasure Island, South Pasadena, St. Petersburg, and Pinellas County. It is expected to benefit 65,000 residents.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Replacing this 43-year-old at-risk sewer force main will reduce the possibility of pipe failure resulting in sewer spills. The pipe is within 3200 feet of Bear Creek, 2800 feet of Boca Ciega Bay Aquatic Preserve, 3600 feet of Eagle Lake, and 1 mile of Lake Pasadena. Replacing this 43-year-old at-risk sewer force main will reduce the possibility of pipe failure resulting in sewer spills. The pipe is within 3200 feet of Bear Creek, 2800 feet of Boca Ciega Bay Aquatic Preserve, 3600 feet of Eagle Lake, and 1 mile of Lake Pasadena. This will be measured by the number of pipe breaks resulting in sewer spills.
