4. Project/Program Description

Replacement of two Neonatal/Pediatric critical care ambulances. Nicklaus Children's Hospital is South Florida's only licensed specialty hospital exclusively for children and includes a fleet of ambulances that are specially equipped for children. This specialty patient transport service allows the hospital to transport children to intensive care units, emergency departments, and medical surgical units, in addition to other facilities in the community.

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Nicklaus is the only freestanding children's hospital in the S. Florida region & Medicaid represents 65% of our patients seeking specialty pediatric care. During COVID, Nicklaus experienced continued operating losses of \$2-3 million per month & had over \$100 million impact in decreased patient revenue. Nicklaus received \$60 million in federal assistance.

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b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Purchase of two Neonatal/Pediatric critical care ambulances which includes all patient compartment needs, communication and radios required, branding, etc. (Chassis, construction/conversion of patient care compartment and additional specialty options including but not limited to blanket warmer for babies/kids staying warm, wider door on side to accommodate two stretcher system & pediatric stretcher.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

This funding would help ensure that Southern Florida families and children have access to operational vehicles equipped to treat the special needs presented by some babies and children. Specifically, the requested new ambulances will be equipped for neonatal and pediatric critical care transport. These ambulances provide an isolette to ensure newborn or recently born infants stay warm & secure during transport, a stretcher for moving all other sized pediatric patients. Inside, we ensure that there is plenty of room to bring a parent or caregiver during an extremely scary time. There are other unique features. Most important is a child receiving transport to facility to receive best expert care.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Our transport team serves our most critical and fragile patients being transferred from referring hospitals to Nicklaus Children's Hospital for a higher level of care and excellence in patient care. Our ambulances are reaching the end of their lifecycle and need to be replaced. Our team provided specialty ground transport for 4,700 patients in 2021. Our immediate service area covers from St. Lucie County to the North, Lee County to the West, and Monroe County to the South with all areas in between these borders. As far as patient populations, we care for all children from very small premature babies to newborns that need whole body cooling, to trauma transfers between hospitals, to kids with heart defects.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

We care for all children from very small premature babies to newborns that need whole body cooling, to trauma transfers between hospitals, to kids with heart defects. In 2021, our team provided specialty transport to 4700 kids, ensuring Floridians have access to high quality care provided by Nicklaus. Nicklaus Children's Hospital is South Florida's only licensed specialty hospital exclusively for children, is renowned for excellence in all aspects of pediatric medicine with many specialty programs routinely ranked among the best in the nation by U.S. News & World Report. Our transport team serves our most critical and fragile patients being transferred from referring hospitals.
