Plantation Acres Improvement District includes over 22,000 residents as well as multiple schools, businesses, and places of worship.

**e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?**

The benefit/outcome is to prevent and reduce flooding, which could potentially damage property, and be a danger to the public at their homes. Surface water quality is also improved with the functioning pump stations, as required by the environmental and drainage agencies. Methodology: The complaints from the residents with respect to the damage to property and accessibility to their homes without standing water, as well as functioning septic tank systems without inundation of standing water. 90% of the District is on septic systems for sewer service. The pump gauges measure the collection of rainwater and the amount of discharge in gallons per minute.
