


Florida's State Attorneys







Combined Priorities For Fiscal Year 2024-2025

















RATE FOR MINIMUM PAY OF \$63,000 FOR ATTORNEYS

- The State Attorneys and Public Defenders hire at competitive pay that we can not match with our minimum pay rate.
- \$40,000 is the current minimum for RC attorneys which no attorney can be hired at that rate.
- This will mostly be a rate change. We currently have very few attorneys below the \$63,000 pay rate. There will be minimal compression issues.

Difference in Retirement Benefits: \$12,570





FEDERAL LAW - A guardian ad litem, who has received training appropriate to the role, including training in early childhood, child, and adolescent development, must be appointed to represent the child in child abuse and neglect proceedings. §42U.S.C. 5106a(b)(2)(B)(xiii).

FLORIDA LAW - A guardian ad litem shall be appointed by the court at the earliest possible time to represent the child in any child abuse, abandonment, or neglect judicial proceeding, whether civil or criminal. § 39.822(1), F.S.



Every child appointed to the Office is assigned a Guardian ad Litem Attorney, a child welfare professional, and hopefully, a Guardian ad Litem Volunteer or pro bono attorney if one is available. All team members are Guardians ad Litem.

Establishing and maintaining a relationship with the child is the foundation of effective guardian ad litem representation.

The Statewide Guardian ad Litem Office represents abused and neglected children in court and the community. The child's multi-disciplinary team always includes a Guardian ad Litem Attorney, a child welfare professional and hopefully a volunteer or pro bono attorney from the child's community if one is available. The team provides independent, high-quality legal representation and community advocacy to protect each child's legal interests. We know that a stable, caring adult in a child's life is vitally important and we continue to recruit volunteers across the state aggressively.

Statewide Guardian ad Litem Office Legal Representation:

- The only party to the case that provides undivided loyalty and zealous independent advocacy to the child.
- Protects and advances the legal rights of children whose age and other limitations prevent them from making their own decisions.
- The only party to the case that provides undivided loyalty to the child.
- Makes the child's wishes known to the court.
- Florida's multi-disciplinary team representation model is national best practice for representing children.
- We advocate for every child's physical safety, emotional well-being, and permanent placement in a stable, nurturing home environment where the child can thrive.
- Promotes permanency for children.

Florida Statutes require the appointment of the Statewide Guardian ad Litem Office in every dependency proceeding. § 39.822(1), F.S.



ISSUE 1: HOPE FLORIDA - PATHWAY TO PROMISE INITIATIVE

SGAL will require two new positions to handle the expansion of the volunteer mentor program and the data entry/tracking associated with the Hope Florida initiative.

- The first position will serve as a recruiter/coordinator to recruit new mentors, monitor mentoring activities and coordinate Hope Florida activities.
- The other position will be responsible for data entry, tracking and reporting for all mentor activities.
- Total request \$128,460





ISSUE 2: REALIGN BUDGET FOR RECURRING CLOUD MIGRATION EXPENDITURES



- The Statewide Guardian ad Litem Office (SGAL) is migrating its data and software applications stored on physical and virtual servers at the NWRDC to the Microsoft Cloud environment. The migration process will be completed by December 31, 2023.
- After the termination of services at NWRDC, all of SGAL's network related expenses will be paid from the Operations category (103230). Based on all current estimates and analyses, SGAL believes the migration project will result in an overall cost savings of \$57,313.
- SGAL lacks sufficient funds in its Operations category to cover the annual cost of all cloud-related expenditures. To make up the difference, SGAL will have to realign its budget and move \$303,019 of the \$360,332 budget currently appropriated in category 210023 (Data Processing NWRDC) to category 103230 (Operations).



ISSUE 3: ATTORNEY RECRUITMENT AND RETENTION

- Recruitment and retention of the more than 200 Guardian ad Litem (GAL) Attorney positions continues to be a major priority for the Statewide Guardian ad Litem Office. SGAL frequently loses potential new hires and experienced attorneys to other State agencies and private law firms that pay higher salaries.
- In order to keep current GAL Attorneys and recruit new GAL Attorneys, the SGAL requests sufficient authority in both General Revenue and Grants and Donations Trust Fund (Title IV-E) for a \$5,000.00 pay increase for all Attorney (8700); Senior Attorney (8701); Managing Attorney (8702) and Regional Counsel (8704) FTE positions.
- Total request \$1,245,375.00





ISSUE 4: CHILD ADVOCACY COORDINATOR COMPENSATION



- The Statewide Guardian ad Litem Office requires employees in the Child Advocate Manager (8401) and Senior Child Advocate Manager (8402) class codes to complete a professional certification program as a condition of employment. The Florida Certification Board require significant in-class training and 1,500 hours of professional work experience as a child advocate for certification. SGAL strongly believes this certification program is necessary to ensure that Guardian ad Litem employees have and maintain a specific level of competency while advocating on behalf of Florida's dependent children.
- SGAL requests \$667,890 to provide a \$1,500 salary increase for each employee in a Child Advocate Manager (8401) and Sr. Child Advocate Manager (8402) class code after one year of employment providing child advocacy services for SGAL and successful completion of the Child Advocate Manager certification program.



ISSUE 5: INCREASE STAFF TO REPRESENT ALL CHILDREN

- The Crime Victims Fund (CVF) was established by the Victims of Crime Act (VOCA) of 1984. It is used to provide crime victim assistance grants to State governments for distribution to community-based organizations and public agencies that provide services directly to crime victims.
- Due to the steady decline in fine and forfeiture deposits into the CVF since at least 2018, funding has been reduced, and the U.S.
 Department of Justice Office for Victims of Crime (OVC) expects the funding reductions to continue in FY 2024 following the President's budget recommendation which lowers the nationwide cap.
- To avoid significant increases in Child Advocate Manager caseloads and the potential for reduction in the quality of legal representation provided in Circuits 1, 2, 3, 11, 15 and 20, the SGAL requests \$1,255,608 in recurring General Revenue funding and 18 FTEs to transition employees currently funded by VOCA grants to the Statewide Office.

CAPITAL COLLATERAL REGIONAL COUNSELS 2024-2025 LEGISLATIVE BUDGET REQUEST

Florida Statute 27.702 requires the Capital Collateral Regional Counsels (CCRCs) to represent death sentenced inmates in the state and federal courts, including the United States Supreme Court, until relief is granted or the sentence of execution is carried out.

There are three offices, North, Middle and South and cases are assigned by the Florida Supreme Court after the direct appeal and are based on the jurisdictions of the Federal District Courts. CCRC offices employ a team concept of assigning a first and second chair attorney and investigator to each case as it proceeds through the postconviction process.

The total General Revenue budget request for all CCRC offices combined for the 2024-2025 fiscal year is \$47,916 broken down by agency as follows:

CCRC-North

- \$8,065 Rental Increase
- \$15,123 (non-recurring) Additional Equipment Copier

CCRC-South

- \$16,728 Information Technology
- \$8,000 (non-recurring) Additional Equipment Video Teleconferencing
- \$50,000 Additional Rate

JAC Legislative Budget Request 2024 Legislative Session

Justice Administrative Commission

The Justice Administrative Commission (JAC), a state agency created in 1965, provides administrative services to 49 judicial-related offices (JROs) and provides compliance and financial review of billings for services provided by private court-appointed attorneys representing indigent persons and associated due process vendors.

In the last fiscal year, working with the Judicial-Related Offices we serve, JAC processed 256,000+ accounting transactions, including 59,000+ court-appointed attorney and due process vendor invoices, 52,000+ payroll and human resources-related transactions, 11,000+ budgetary transactions, and 520+ public records requests; contracted with 1,600+ registry and indigent for cost attorneys and 600+ due process vendors; attended 800+ hearings for state payment of indigent defense costs; and responded to 14,000+ motions for payment of state-funded indigent defense costs. This workload was met with 92 staff and a budget of \$8.3 million through its partnership with the Legislature, systemic cross-training of staff, and continuous development and update of our processes for increased efficiency, accountability, and customer convenience. It is important to highlight that JAC currently meets and exceeds its statutory duties with a budget that represents 0.72 percent of the total appropriations it administers. However, additional resources are needed to continue meeting the agency's statutory requirements to serve our customers, who, in turn, serve the judiciary and the taxpayers of Florida.

JAC's sole Legislative Budget Request for the FY 2024-25 for Executive Leadership is focused on JAC's Vision: To be the model of exemplary state government.
