

With your help, my staff and I have successfully completed the six committee weeks ahead of the 2020 Legislative Session! Thank you for your steadfast support, engagement, and guidance through these past few months. Because of you, we are in an excellent position going into session, which begins on Tuesday, January 14, 2020.

Here's a look at what's been happening in Tallahassee and throughout our community:

## **Unanimous Support for Meaningful Legislation**



Early Childhood Music Education Incentive Program: This program is one of my top priorities, and I believe that adopting music education into K-2 is the most transformative, cost-effective way to positively impact early childhood education. Studies have already shown that exposure to fine arts increases tests scores and fosters lifelong creativity, and this pilot program will allow the University of Florida to study just how much music classes impact learning gains, social development, and teamwork. Happy to have recieved unanimous support from the Education Committee members!

<u>Peer-to-Peer Support for First Responders</u>: It is estimated that nationwide, 84 percent of first responders have experienced a traumatic event on the job, and for the past few years, we have lost more law enforcement officials to suicide than in

the line of duty. Our bill allows confidentiality to first responders who confide in their fellow first responders about the personal and professional tolls of the job. This week, this bill unanimously passed its second committee stop!

<u>Back to School Tax Holiday</u>: We are one step closer to saving Florida families money as they prepare their children for the 2020 school year! From July 31 through August 9, 2020, tax-exempt items would include clothing and bags under \$60, school supplies under \$15, and computers and related accessories under \$1,000. During this year's holiday, Floridians save more than \$36 million.

Vines Hospital in Ocala provides individualized mental health and addiction services. Last week, they opened their new HOPE Program for Veterans. The program offers outpatient and residential treatment options for veterans with PTSD and trauma. For more info, their number is (352) 671-3130.
