1	From the funds provided in Specific Appropriations XXXX through XXXX, the (AGENCY/DEPARTMENT) shall submit quarterly reports on all travel related to training, seminars, workshops, conferences, or similarly purposed travel that was completed by senior management employees and division or program directors. Each quarterly report shall include the following information: (a) employee name, (b) position title, (c) purpose of travel, (d) dates and location of travel, (e) confirmation of agency head authorization if required by HB 5003, and (f) total travel cost. The report shall be submitted to the chair of the Senate Appropriations Committee, the chair of the House of Representatives Appropriations Committee, and the Executive Office of the Governor's Office of Policy and Budget. 1	<p>SECTION 23. The sum of \$250,000 in nonrecurring funds from the Regulatory Trust Fund is hereby appropriated to the Florida Public Service Commission to prepare a study of the efficacy and costs of all technically feasible storm hardening measures for the electric power grid. The study, at a minimum, shall (1) take into account all available post-storm forensic data, (2) identify specific storm hardening measures that are likely to be most effective at reducing the number, frequency, and duration of storm related power outages in certain regions of the state or certain types of geographic regions, (3) evaluate the cost-effectiveness of each measure, and (4) evaluate funding mechanisms for storm hardening projects and provide recommendations concerning the use of specific funding mechanisms, including processes for approval of funding for projects. The study may also include a recommendation for a state administered grant program for which local governments, in conjunction with utilities, may apply for grants to partially fund specific storm hardening projects. The study shall be submitted to the chair of the Senate Appropriations Committee, the chair of the House of Representatives Appropriations Committee, and the Executive Office of the Governor's Office of Policy and Budget no later than June 1, 2018. This section is effective upon becoming law.</p> <p><u>SECTION XX. The sum of \$250,000 in nonrecurring funds from the Regulatory Trust Fund is hereby appropriated to the Florida Public Service Commission for Fiscal Year 2017-2018 to review and prepare a report on storm preparedness and restoration activities of Florida's electric utilities and, upon completion of this report, to review and prepare a separate report on the efficacy and costs of storm hardening measures for the electric power grid. The review and report on storm preparedness and restoration activities, at a minimum, shall (1) take into account all available post-storm forensic data, (2) assess the performance of overhead and underground transmission and distribution facilities, (3) examine the storm restoration practices of the electric utilities, (4) assess vegetation management and pole inspection practices, and (5) examine electric utility communication practices with customers and local governments. The report shall be submitted to the Governor, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, and the President of the Senate no later than August 1, 2018. The review and report on the efficacy and costs of storm hardening measures, at a minimum, shall (1) take into account the information and findings from the completed review and report on storm preparedness and restoration activities, (2) identify storm hardening measures that may reduce the number, frequency, and duration of storm related power outages in certain regions of the state or certain types of geographic regions, (3) assess the benefits and costs of storm hardening measures, and (4) examine funding mechanisms for electric utility storm hardening projects and provide recommendations concerning the use of specific funding mechanisms, including processes for approval of funding for projects. The report may also include a recommendation for a state administered grant program for which local governments, in conjunction with utilities, may apply for grants to partially fund specific storm hardening utilities. The report shall be submitted to the Governor, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, and the President of the Senate no later than March 1, 2019. The unexpended balance of funds as of June 30, 2018, shall revert, and is appropriated for Fiscal Year 2018-2019 for the same purpose.
