<u>The citizens will benefit by a more vibrant economy with additional highly-compensated employment</u> opportunities as result of the growing aviation, space related and technical industries which are locating to, or expanding in Florida's Space Coast.

Florida's Space Coast has grown due to companies such as Space X, Blue Origin and Northrup Grumman. Florida's Universities provide the engineers needed, many companies find it difficult to hire the necessary technical support staff to support their engineers. Companies find it difficult to recruit these positions nationally and would prefer to recruit locally. Approval will allow students to receive the technical training needed to be able to attain these opportunities, which will improve educational opportunities, economic activity, tourism, job opportunities, and economic self-sufficiency. The project will provide an increased number of graduates ready to assume the technological support positions needed to allow our space, aviation and technology industries to continue to thrive on the Space Coast. We will ensure success by monitoring outcomes to include numbers of graduates, types of training offered, corporate satisfaction, wage earnings and increased economic prosperity.
