### 4. Project/Program Description:

Phase I- An National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) Study is required to begin this project. Broward County Transit (BCT) currently operates a major bus transit transfer facility (Broward Central Terminal) in downtown Fort Lauderdale, located on the north side of Broward Blvd., adjacent to (east of) the Florida East Coast (FEC) railway line. This is BCT's busiest transfer location, with over 17,000 daily passenger bus trips occurring daily. "Brightline" a privately-funded passenger rail service that will begin service and feature stops in Miami, Fort Lauderdale and West Palm Beach. BCT will begin operating the WAVE streetcar system in early 2021 in downtown Fort Lauderdale. The facility is inadequate for long term anticipated future bus service growth, and forthcoming multimodal services coming to this site and/or site vicinity in the next four years.

a. What is the specific purpose or goal that will be achieved by the funds requested?

A new Downtown Multi-modal Transit Center will provide state-of-the art integrated services that will be able to accommodate future bus growth, multimodal services (All Aboard Florida, WAVE, Ride-Share programs), and an increase in passenger activity. Redevelopment and expansion of this terminal into an integrated multimodal central station site with ability to have mixed land use development around and above the current property will result in an increase in economic development.

b. What are the activities and services that will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Broward County seeks an Appropriation Request for \$5,000,000 to initiate a Phase I (Planning/Preliminary Design/NEPA) assessment of the Downtown Broward Central Transit Terminal site in order to accurately evaluate operational/customer needs, site conditions, site development opportunities, and funding alternatives for advancing a new central station facility at this active multimodal location.

### d. What are the direct services to be provided to citizens by the appropriations project?

Multi-modal transportation connections with Broward County Transit bus routes, Community Bus routes, the upcoming WAVE streetcar, Brightline Passenger rail, rideshare, bikeshare, taxis, TNCs and pedestrian.

#### e. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Current and future residents (1.9 million as of 2016) and visitors in Broward County and the South Florida region will immediately benefit from an enhanced and optimized regional multimodal transportation facility in downtown Fort Lauderdale. All users will have better access to jobs with such enhanced connectivity. The ability to develop mixed-use development, potentially with public and private partnership funding, may lead to additional job creation and accessibility at the site.

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f. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The \$1M funding of Phase I allows Broward County to begin to prepare and seek to improve on this County-owned, strategic multimodal transportation site. A successful Phase I analysis of the site will allow the County to assess the site and all multimodal connectivity and economic development opportunities. In addition, a Phase I analysis will allow the County to engage the public, transportation users, the private sector, stakeholders, and decision makers to come to an agreement on the optimal growth and change needed at this site.
