By providing enhanced water quality treatment of runoff and debris interception prior to release into sinks, this project will restore wildlife habitat, rehydrate wetlands, and improve discharge into the Floridian aquifer and will directly benefit the Wakulla Springs springshed.

Approximately 65 acres of the park wetland area will benefit from the grade restoration efforts and is expected to remove 5 tons of floatable debris entering the sink each year.
