Purchase and renovation of existing property for the establishment of the Lealman Community and Recreation Center located in the Lealman Community Redevelopment Area (designated CRA per Chapter 163, F.S.). The campus facility will function as a community hub to reach all segments of the community, based on community partnerships. Services include formal recreation opportunities, after school programs, adult education, and workforce development education. Facility programming will be fluid and based on community needs/demands.

identifies the need for an array of community facilities in the Lealman Community.

While the funding request is for a fixed asset (property purchase) the end use of the facility, through partner organizations utilizing available space, will provide a range of services including recreational, educational, workforce development, etc.

d. What are the direct services to be provided to citizens by the appropriations project?

The Community and Recreation Center will house programs to benefit those in the Community Redevelopment Area. These programs will include educational, cultural, economic development, and recreational programs, services and activities for children and adults. Examples include, educational and job training programs, after school childcare, youth empowerment/crime deterrence, small business assistance, recreational sports and arts programs, and other programs based on the need in the community at the time. Additionally, the facility would be cross-purposed as an emergency shelter in the event of a hurricane or other disaster event.

e. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

All residents of the community redevelopment area, particularly children, those seeking education and employment training, and the elderly. The benefit of additional shelter space would extend to the entire region. The target populations include: Elderly persons, persons with poor mental health, persons with poor physical health, jobless persons, economically disadvantaged persons, at-risk youth, homeless, developmentally disabled persons, physically disabled persons, preschool students, grade school students, high school students, university/college students, currently or formerly incarcerated persons, drug offenders (in criminal justice) and victims of crime.

f. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Increased availability to health and recreation programs; public space for cultural and art events; increased availability of education programs not currently available in the area, including but not limited to on-site tutoring, evacuation shelter, provision of small business support, education, and incentive programs; and

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increased educational and workforce training opportunities; increased youth school attendance, lower juvenile crime rates, and access to at-risk youth empowerment programs. Outcomes will be measured by any variety of methods that are most appropriate for the specific program, service, etc. For instance, outcomes could include program participation rates, program graduates, number of hosted events, specific services requested, program creation, and additional county shelter space capacity made available.
