(1) Educational school tours: All school tour curriculums will be backed by Florida State Standards and involve living history, agriculture, history and science. (2) Living history: Students and staff in period costume will interpret farming/agricultural chores such as tallow and candle making, wine making, gardening, dyeing cloth, farming, etc. (3) Interpretive nature trail: Signs along the trail will showcase indigenous and invasive trees, plants and flowers and include QR codes that link to the Next Exit History app. (4) Historic orchard consisting of pear and pecan trees.

  Pre-school students, Grade schools students, High School Students, and University and College Students

  - 1. Enrich Cultural Experience The historic Farmstead and subsequent educational programming will give visitors a view into what rural agrarian life was like in early Northwest Florida. The site and barn will serve as a venue for community events. 2. Improve quality of education Educational programming and lesson plans will be created around the story of the farm. We will offer tours, field trips, and public programming designed to educate on farming and Florida's rich history. 3. Increase or improve economic activity Having a museum facility within the area will promote tourism as well as benefit the local economy by providing a place for visitors to come and enjoy the history of the area. 4. Create specific immediate job opportunities Once the historic farmstead is opened it will create need to be staffed by two full time positions and four part time positions.
