11. Program Performance:

a. What is the specific purpose or goal that will be achieved by the funds requested?

The Florida Department of Economic Opportunity (2017), reported that there is a severe shortage of individuals skilled in Information Technology in the United States including Florida. The report underscored computer related jobs, which represented 12 of the top 20 science, technology, engineering and math (STEM), advertised jobs. These positions included Software and Applications Developers, Computer User Support Specialists, Computer Systems Analysts, Web Developers, Information Security Analysts, Computer Programmers, and Computer Systems Engineers and Architects. The highest demands for STEM, are in counties that circumference large metropolitan areas such as Hillsborough County, Orange County, Miami-Dade County, Broward County, and Duval County. Computer Mentors Group is already closing the digital divide gap and building a pipeline of Information Technology talent for local employers, and has been doing so for the last 20 year

b. What are the activities and services that will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

With the assistance from the State of Florida, Computer Mentors will use its capacity to provide technology training programs to host a set of summer computer training camps, focusing on coding, programming and Cyber security. The camps are intended to be housed at the University Mall right next to University of South Florida which is conveniently located and has a food court. We will hire industry certified instructors and college students that are pursuing STEM degrees, to teach high school and middle school students information technology skills in coding, programming and Cyber security. Students who are interested in information



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technology and want to pursue continuing education are welcome to enroll in Computer Mentors' year round program to earn industry certifications.

We will provide technology training services to a minimum of 180 youth.

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e. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target population is middle and high school youth. Income and other demographic criteria do not apply and there will be no restriction based upon sex, income, race, or religion. However, every effort will be made to recruit a diverse population of youth.

f. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

This program will underscore career and technical education (CTE) skills in the Information Technology industry that is not currently being offered in existing school systems. Economically, over time this innovative program will provide potential employees with skills and resources required by all corporations. The career and technical education (CTE) skills in the Information Technology industry can positively impact the juvenile justice population in ways of increasing participation, as youth learn computer skills that could possibly lead to high demand jobs, by enrolling in the after school program at Computer Mentors to follow the paths of earning a series of industry certifications in IT infrastructure and/or Software Development. Youth will be fully engaged during the out-of-school time (OST).
