4. Project/Program Description:

Over 300,000 children in the state of Florida have a parent incarcerated. Research demonstrates that these children are acutely at-risk for anti-social behaviors, mental illness and cognitive delays stemming from exposure to Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACE). Program will identify 150 youth, between 12-25, who are at greatest risk for interaction with juvenile justice system and will provide a minimum of 6 job readiness training sessions, mentoring and internship placement.

d. What are the direct services to be provided to citizens by the appropriations project?

Child-centered bonding visit at FDC designed to foster bond between child and incarcerated parent, while exploring career interests through personality and strengths assessments. Minimum of 6 ongoing job readiness training sessions, including resume building, interview preparedness and others for 150 youth ages 12-25 throughout the state. 85% of youths participating job readiness training program will be placed in a summer internship. Program will also include a "speakers bureau" of formerly incarcerated individuals who can be deployed to speak to at-risk youth about the realities of incarceration and risky behaviors.

e. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

150 children between the ages of 12-25 with an incarcerated parent, at risk for involvement with criminal justice system.

f. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

_150 youth between the ages of 12-15 with an incarcerated parent at risk of interaction with the criminal justice system will be enrolled in a year long job readiness and employability training program. Youth will participate in a minimum of six job readiness trainings, mentorship and placement in a summer internship.

 \$1,000 financial consequence for every child under the proposed 150 not having completed 75% of ongoing job readiness training; \$1,000 financial consequence for every percentage point of enrolled participants under 75% without placement in a summer internship program.
