This project will close a portion of McCoy's Creek Blvd from Cherokee Street to Margaret Street to vehicular traffic and re-use the road bed as a greenway trail. Adjacent parcels, frequently inaccessible due to flooding will be provided alternative access by road improvements out of the floodplain. Additionally, this phase of the project would elevate the bridges that cross the creek at King Street and Stockton Street above the 100 year flood plain while removing the existing bridges at Leland Street and Swan Street as well as perform any of the environmental remediation cited in the remediation plan for the former Forest Street Incinerator Site which is located just one block from McCoy's Creek. The remediation would include re-stabilizing of the creek banks and slopes.
