Advancing the educational opportunities in computer programming (code), and cultural enrichment in ballet, opera, and violin education.

 - Kids and teens visiting 3 community center ages 7 15. We anticipate serving 330 students per week (13,300 students in a 10 month period). Serving the citizens of Districts 45 & 46.

 - For coding, Winter Park Technical College shall test the students skills. For ballet, opera, and violin training, community center counselours shall monitor students progress and attendance in order for the child to be able to advanced to an upper or a more difficulty level.
