Resurfacing of the roadway; bike lanes installation of traffic calming devices, installation of landscaping and irrigation system.

These projects benefit three cities and serve as a transportation route for a total population of 267,037.

These projects consist of the total construction of approximately 3.0 miles of two transportation enhancement roadways that include storm water system upgrades, concrete sidewalks, resurfacing of the roadway, bike lanes, installation of traffic calming devices, and the installation of landscaping and an irrigation system.

Once the City selects a contractor to preform the scope of services, a series of pre-construction meetings will occur to establish time line, objectives etc. If the selected contractor does not meet the given objectives, the City would then issue a warning, if the penalties continue, the City will then liquidate the damage and start the performance bond process.
