d. What are the direct services to be provided to citizens by the appropriations project?

Studies and experience show that this type of prison programming reduces recidivism and further crimes in society, reunites families with greater stability for the family, and provides a safer environment for correctional personnel while inmates are in prison. With defined programs and trained volunteers, inmates will receive in a supportive environment, counseling in the areas of anger management, skill development (academic), financial literacy, and personal responsibility.

<u>Inmates in Florida prisons which participate in Faith and Character based programs. 730 individuals directly served.</u>

f. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The outcome expected is reduced prison recidivism, reduced inmate disciplinary reports while in prison, employment rate increase for ex-offenders and greater family stability. All of these have mechanisms for monitoring and evaluating outcomes in place. A new Offender Rehabilitation Assessment will be administered as well as recidivism and disciplinary tracking.
