The Rosemary Corridor connects West Palm Beach's thriving downtown business district to the Northwest Neighborhood, a historic African American community and a top priority of the City. Rosemary Avenue was once the commercial hub of the Historic Northwest, but has fallen into vacancy and disrepair. Along with private and community partners, West Palm Beach aims to make Rosemary a thriving "main street" connecting two traditionally disconnected neighborhoods through a streetscape redesign and enhanced lighting. The results of the program will be enhanced safety, appearance, and mobility of this underserved, historic community and to encourage new private investment along the Rosemary Corridor.

d. What are the direct services to be provided to citizens by the appropriations project?

Enhanced decorative lighting will be purchased and installed along the west side of Rosemary Avenue between 1st Street to 8th Street. This state investment will complement the \$2.1M streetscape project budgeted by the City during the same period. This corridor improvement will also serve as a companion to the significant upgrade of CityPlace (a significant retail/shopping hub) along Rosemary Avenue just south of this lighting effort and forthcoming private investment along the corridor.

- e. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?
 - <u>51,000</u> approximate count of Historic Northwest neighborhood residents and anticipated visitor count to the <u>Sunset Lounge once completed.</u>
- f. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?
 - 1) Reduce crime and increase perception of safety on the Rosemary Corridor (as evidenced by the number of reported crimes before and after project and recorded average speeds noted via a speed study before and after enhancement); 2) Increased illumination of the street at night (as evidenced by before and after photometric analysis); 3) Increased private investment along the corridor (before/after comparison of private investment as evidenced by building permits along corridor).
