d. What are the direct services to be provided to citizens by the appropriations project?

<u>The funding will provide the capital needed to build a training/therapy center where Veterans are transitioned</u> to civilian life and receive group and individual therapy for PTSD and other combat issues.

e. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Veterans. In the current facility, the group is limited in the scope and number of Veterans they are able to help. The new training/therapy center is expected to be able to reach more than 800 veterans annually with the addition of the new building that this request would support. Many of the activities are workshops for Veterans (ex. Financial management workshop, family communication workshop, re-integrating back into civilian life), group counseling meetings, and individual counseling; however, they do not currently have a room that will accommodate more than 20 people at a time. Furthermore, due to limited indoor office space, 3-4 doctors and researchers currently share a 10x10 office space, which limits the number of clients served.

f. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Veterans suffering with PTSD who have gone through this program report improved relationships with family and friends, the ability to get off medications, an improved outlook and levels of hopefulness, and increased understanding of how to relate to people and handle issues. Working in partnership with the University of Central Florida College of Medicine and a local mental health therapist, the group uses standard measurement methodologies, such as PCL-M, McChord PTSD Scoring, Beck Depression Inventory, Burns Anxiety Inventory, and Collins Reviseed Adult Attachment Scale to measure outcomes.

Osceola County owns the property and existing facilities, which were specifically built for McCormick Research Institute and the work with Veterans in partnership with the University of Central Florida College of Medicine. This is the only partnership in the United States that includes a nonprofit entity, a University, and a County conducting a research study on the benefits of equine-assisted therapy for Veterans with PTSD.
