<u>Provision of sanitary sewer</u>

e. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target population is the Joint Planning Area (as defined by Oakland and Orange County by mutual agreement) which is projected at buildout to be approximately 10,000. New residential construction will result in approximately half of those projected residents to be served by sanitary sewer vs. septic systems. Existing residential customers will be added over time as financing allows. All commercial and industrial existing and future development will convert to or build on sanitary sewer as will the Oakland Avenue Charter School and all public buildings.

f. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The funds requested would facilitate the completion of the 'spine' wastewater corridor along SR 50 and allow the implementation of economic development in the 100+ vacant commercial acres adjacent to Turnpike Exit 272. This will establish a balanced economic base for the Town, which would allow more reasonable taxing structure. In addition, this 'spine' affords the base for new commercial and non-commercial growth to not reply on septic systems and provides the necessary system for removing existing commercial and non-commercial entities from septic sewer systems. Measurements include: changes in ad valorem, sales, and other taxes, receipts from new construction (impact fees, utility hookup fees, planning/zoning/permit fees; number of construction and permanent jobs created; number of new sewer hookups; number of units removed from septic systems; general environmental quality improvement.

- g. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for in the contract?

 Restrictions on future funding. However, we have diligently maintained performance schedules and do not expect to fail in this area.
