#### **11.** Program Performance:

#### a. What is the specific purpose or goal that will be achieved by the funds requested?

<u>The funds will be used to provide an updated and safe learning and training environment for our 140</u> <u>firefighting students and the 600+ firefighters in our region who receive continuing education in the facility.</u>

#### b. What are the activities and services that will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Working equipment is vital to the optimum and safe training of firefighting students. Our current 3 firetrucks were purchased in 1995 and 1996. These trucks are frequently breaking down and hindering the learning process. With these funds we propose to purchase two new fire trucks. In addition, our safety gear for faculty is old and requires frequent repairs, we will purchase 25 sets of gear. Project funds will be used to update and renovate the existing fire training tower and related grounds. Updating will include: the installation of safety lighting, four hydrants, the purchase of simulators/props, roof access props, communications equipment, bomb proof anchors to enable student rappelling and rope rescue. Funds will also allow the purchase of a turn out gear extractor which is used for cleaning contaminated firefighter gear post fire.

# d. What are the direct services to be provided to citizens by the appropriations project?

<u>SSC will be able to assure that current and future staffing needs for local fire departments will be met. New</u> fire fighters will be prepared to meet the challenges of today's changing high risk environment. Emergency management in the communities will be enhanced by using an all-hazards approach to training.

#### e. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

<u>The target populations are: the 140 firefighting students Seminole State trains per year and all current and future firefighters (600 +) in Seminole County. Firefighting is on Region 12's targeted occupations list as a designated HSHW (high skill high wage) occupation.</u>

# f. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Expected outcomes and benefits from this project are: more fully prepared firefighting graduates from Seminole State College, an enhanced safe learning environment for students and faculty and advanced training for current employed firefighters. In addition graduates will be more fully prepared for the high risk nature of the job thereby reducing orientation times and saving fire departments time and costs. Seminole State will



utilize its Advisory Committee to monitor the progress and goal attainment of this project. The Advisory Committee is comprised of area fire chiefs and training directors.

- g. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for in the contract?
  Seminole State College has found over time that its existing performance penalties are sufficient to insure that deliverables are consistently met. In addition, SSCwill be monitored and held accountable by the FI. Bureau of Fire Standards and Training. A progress improvement plan will be developed in the unlikely event that progress toward goals is not achieved.
