11. Program Performance:

a. What is the specific purpose or goal that will be achieved by the funds requested?

To create a more stable small business environment led by a cadre of early learning owners and operators who have the business education and acumen in the early learning industry to successfully operate child care businesses given socio economic realities. Low — moderate centers and home-based businesses that accept school readiness subsidies will be better able to manage their available financial resources because they understand cash flow; how to use their square footage; get better pricing from vendors, and better landlord concessions. Upon entering the industry they will have obtained the business acumen to run a sustainable profitable center. They will maximize their resources and not rely solely on subsidies or fees so that additional funds will be available to ensure quality learning. This will create a more cohesive business structure for the early learning industry.

b. What are the activities and services that will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Program 1 – Expanding and marketing our early learning childcare industry training program for early learning center and home-based business owners, operators, administrators and those who would like to enter into the industry. These regional trainings would be based on our South Florida model, run by The Business and Leadership Institute for Early Learning and offered for the State of Florida Early Learning Industry. Program 2: The on-line curriculum and on-line education program including a platform for business planning regarding all the basic essentials necessary to open and operate a quality childcare center or home-based childcare business in the State of Florida. The on-line platform will help individuals to develop their business acumen and offer

d. What are the direct services to be provided to citizens by the appropriations project?

Learning opportunities through Business & Leadership Institute for Early Learning Business curriculum available on-line; Regional workshops conducted by Business Leadership Institue for Early Learning to support on-line program; business mentorship opportunities where program graduates mentor new participants in developing business plans and strategies. Continue business consultation for program participants with our partnering agencies such as SCORE, Prospera and Small Business Development Centers throughout the State.

e. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Owners, operators, administrators and those entering the early learning industry as small business owners and operators of centers and home-based businesses including those persons in low income geographic areas or more remote. Children and families who are placed in low – moderate income independent child care centers and home-based childcare. Women who are the primary workforce as early learning practitioners; Local businesses who depend upon dependable quality childcare so that their workforce can be focused and productive.

f. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Create specific immediate job opportunities by increasing enrollment and / or program expansion necessitating the hiring of more teachers. Enhance specific individual's economic self sufficiency by creating the ability to draft budgets and manage available funds more efficiently. Owner ability to take salary, pay for social security, acquire new capital. Increase or improve economic activity by creating additional funds to retain and recruit employees, increase salaries and benefits, purchase additional learning materials. Improve quality education by reinvesting increase revenue into materials, accreditations, professional development and salaries. In the first year we expect to serve approximately 600 owners, operators, directors and those planning to open a childcare center or home based business though our on-line component and regional workshops targeting rural areas statewide.
