The 30 year old wastewater utility is malfunctioning and failing to provide wastewater treatment to permit or design standards. Hurricane Irma's landfall crippled the already-crumbling infrastructure leading to the use of a bypass tank for final water treatment, including disinfection. The plant is located at the intersection of the environmentally sensitive Ten Thousand Islands/Everglades National Park and the Big Cypress National Preserve. Procurement and installation of a wastewater bypass plant that meets State-set effluent standards.

Eliminate the combined domestic/commercial wastewater and stormwater discharge to the environmentally sensitive Ten Thousand Islands/Everglades/Big Cypress National Park area.
