#### 11. Program Performance:

a. What is the specific purpose or goal that will be achieved by the funds requested?

The City of Coral Springs will use Public Safety Answering Point (Dispatch Center) to achieve interoperability to allow for elimination of 911 call transfers to initiate an emergency response by police, fire and EMS. Currently Broward county is working towards an initiative to enhance response to life threatening emergency calls. This purchase is imperative for a successful closest unit request countywide.

- b. What are the activities and services that will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

  This equipment and software will provide integration of 911 call answering.
- c. What are the direct services to be provided to citizens by the appropriations project?

The dispatching of emergency responders to calls for all emergency and non emergency calls for service.

- d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

  The 278,642 residents of Coral Springs, Parkland, Margate and Coconut Creek will benefit from this project.
- e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The expected benefit of this is to provide interoperability to allow for seamless emergency response without the need to transfer calls to initiate that emergency response. The outcome will be measured by the reduction in the number of calls, the reduction in overall response time by police and fire, and will provide the closest unit response for fire and EMS.
