To address the shortage of psychiatrists and other mental health and addiction providers and to provide mental health and addiction services to residents of Indian River and surrounding counties. This is also an education site where training is provided to medical students, residents (doctors who are in their first three years of practice, supervised by senior level medical faculty) and fellows (doctors who have completed three years of residency training and are pursuing an optional additional year of specialized training) for community psychiatry, psychology and addiction specialists.

- b. What are the activities and services that will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?
 - 1) Training for medical students, residents, fellows and post doctoral associates in the mental health and addiction specialties. 2) Clinical care of patients/residents of Indian River and surrounding counties.
- c. What are the direct services to be provided to citizens by the appropriations project?

Clinical services to meet the demand for mental health treatment and addition treatment services to residents of the service counties. Outpatient services including medication management, psychotherapy, psychological testing and addiction treatment.

 - All residents including low income persons in need of mental health and addiction treatment services in Indian River and surrounding counties. More than 800 (the Center has over 10,000 total clinic visits per year).
- e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

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Children, families and seniors have decreased mental and behavioral health issues. Measure using number of unique patients served in the fiscal year who received a mental health screening vs. the number of those who received a screening and returned to receive intervention services.
