Covers operating costs and program expenses for the National Flight Academy. The National Flight Academy will continue to innovate and inspire students in the fields of STEM, utilizing the funding from the state of Florida to maintain and expand its educational programs through program development that explores areas such as Aviation Maintenance via Virtual Reality (VR) and Maker 3-D printing. Moreover, NFA will create a Career Pathways Program to connect students to STEM-related universities and technical training centers. These program developments will allow the National Flight Academy to design a wider range of educational modules. Additionally, this funding will allow NFA to review educational sequences and objectives for these modules, train staff, and produce materials that will continue to foster innovative thinking for all the students that come aboard AMBITION and participate in its immersive aviation-themed learning programs.

a. What is the specific purpose or goal that will be achieved by the funds requested?

The goal of the National Flight Academy's Gateway programs is to inspire and engage students in the fields of Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM) through the delivery of immersive and innovative educational programs that highlight various career pathways for Florida students.

b. What are the activities and services that will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The NFA Gateway project will involve the delivery of the following programs and services aboard the NFA's simulated aircraft carrier; an aviation maintenance three-day program for students in grades 7-12 that will utilize virtual reality technology to give students a glimpse of various aspects of aviation technological operations; a Career Pathways Program designed to connect students who opt into the program with STEM-

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related colleges, universities and technical training centers which align to the students' indicated interests and; a Career Pathways Coordinator position to oversee the Career Pathways Program. Additionally, NFA will provide a six-day Cyber Security Program which will enhance the variety of computer science fields the students will be exposed to at NFA.

- c. What are the direct services to be provided to citizens by the appropriations project?
 Education program services will be provided to Florida students through this appropriations project.
- d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

 At-risk youth, grade school students and high school students. More than 800 individuals are expected to be served.
- e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

This project will generate numerous benefits including an enriched cultural experience, an improved quality of education, an increase/improvement in economic activity and an increase in tourism. The National Flight Academy performs educational assessments on all students that participate in the six-day Deployment programs. NFA utilizes these assessments in order to determine students' STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics) based knowledge at the beginning and end of the six-day program in order to measure retention of knowledge. This data is collected via Turning Technologies Response Cards that students utilize throughout their participation in the Deployment program. Please see the attached Student Analytics report.
