Title of Project: Directions for Living - Community Action Team (CAT) for Babies

4. Project/Program Description:

In 2013 the GAA directed the DCF to create CAT teams to provide comprehensive, community based services to children ages 11-21 with a mental health or co-occurring substance abuse. The goal is to wrap services around children who are at risk of out of home placement as evidenced by repeated failures in less intensive levels of care; having 2 or more hospitalizations or repeated failures; involvement with DJJ or multiple episodes involving law enforcement; or poor academic performance or suspensions. The ACE Study has proven that for all children under age 18 who endured a traumatic event, the event will impact their life moving forward. The Directions for Living BabyCAT team expands service delivery to children under age 5 who have been removed from their parents. The CAT team will work with the family unit to increase parental bonding, address substance misuse and co-occurring mental illness. The goal will be to expedite permanency and provide treatment to the parents and the child.

11. Program Performance:

a. What is the specific purpose or goal that will be achieved by the funds requested?

The Directions for Living BabyCAT team will focus on expedited permanency and increased parental bonding for infants and children under the age of 5 who have been removed from their parents due to substance misuse or co-occurring mental illness.

b. What are the activities and services that will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The Directions for Living BabyCAT team will consist of a dependency case manager, counselor and peer mentor who will work intensively with the parents to improve their protective capacities and to specifically target the parent-child relationship through the use of the Evidence Based Model, Child-Parent Psychotherapy. Child-Parent Psychotherapy is an attachment therapy for children aged birth through 5 years who are showing mental health or behavioral problems. The treatment is geared towards children who have experienced trauma caused by significant adverse childhood experiences such as abuse or neglect. The BabyCAT team will serve as the dependency case manager and treatment provider in the Pinellas County Early Childhood Court.

c. What are the direct services to be provided to citizens by the appropriations project?

The services provided will include; Case Management, Substance Abuse Treatment, Child-Parent Psychotherapy, Mental Health Counseling, Supervised Visitation between Parent and Child, as well as any other community based service needed to safely expedite permanency.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target population includes children birth to age 5 who have been removed from their parents due to substance misuse and/or co-occurring mental illness. This project will serve 25-50 children and their parents.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Outcome 1: Improve Quality of Education - The BabyCAT team will increase enrollment of children into Trauma-Informed, Quality Early Learning Childcare. The method of measurement will demonstrate 90% of children enrolled in BabyCAT will be enrolled in a trauma informed, quality early learning daycare provider. Outcome 2: Enhance the economic self-sufficiency of parents whose children have been separated due to substance misuse - The BabyCAT team will increase employment or enrollment in benefits for parents enrolled. The method of measurement will include that 100% of parents will be linked to Career Source, SNAP benefits, SOAR (if applicable) and the Pinellas County Health Plan (if eligible). Outcome 3: Reduce the recidivism of children removed from their substance misusing parents from returning to the child welfare system. - The method of measurement will show that 95% of children served by BabyCAT will not experience a return to care within 12 months of achieving permanency
