#### a. What is the specific purpose or goal that will be achieved by the funds requested?

AMIkids Family Centric Model incorporates family engagement and alliance so that the prevention and intervention services with youth have a long term impact. In 2018-2019, AMIkids provided additional services through the model to youth enrolled in the gender specific and day treatment programs and continued to provide an evaluation to assess and improve the quality of evidence-based services delivery and promising delinquency interventions for this population.

#### b. What are the activities and services that will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Youth will receive screening and assessment to determine eligibility for Family Centric Model services. Youth who are between the ages of 11 and 18 who voluntarily enroll, and who have at least three of the following five risk factors receive Family Centric Model direct services: 1) family instability and conflict, 2) school instability or failure, 3) physical health and mental health problems, 4) attitude/behavior problems, or 5) victimization history.

Primary prevention and intervention services include gender-specific life management skills training that addresses trauma and fosters positive gender identity development; individual transition plans and transition services; career exploration, career planning, and development of school to work employability skills; community and service learning opportunities; and youth development activities. Family Centric Model direct services include in-home services provided by family support specialists, family psychoeducation sessions, and supportive services including counseling referrals.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The following populations would be served by this project: persons with poor mental health, jobless persons, economically disadvantaged persons, at-risk youth, drug users, grade school students, high school students, currently for formerly incarcerated persons, drug offenders. AMIkids has a goal of serving 3,200 people (1000 students with average family size of 3.2).

- e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?
  - 1. Improve mental health Students will receive the Prevention Assessment Tool (PAT) assessment and the Community Positive Achievement Change Tool (C-PACT) assessment. 2. Reduce recidivism Students will receive the PAT. Specific domains addressed through the AMIkids Family Centric Model are use of free time, relationships, family/living arrangements, attitudes/behaviors, aggression and skills. 3. Divert from criminal/juvenile justice system Youth assigned to the treatment group and the control group will be tracked throughout the evaluation to determine whether they have committed a law offense during services. All youth will be tracked to determine whether they are adjudicated for any law offense within 12-months of program release. 4. Improved family functioning Texas Christian University (TCU) Family and Friends Assessment (FFA) and the McMaster Family Assessment Device (FAD) will be administered at intake and release.
