11. Program Performance:

a. What is the specific purpose or goal that will be achieved by the funds requested?

Support the implementation of projects that introduce middle and high school students of high poverty neighborhoods in Orlando to TEACHING as a career choice; provide "bridges" that they cross over to enter college and university programs ready to participate and be successful in teacher education programs; assist



them in completing teacher education programs and returning to urban neighborhoods to work as teachers. Provide family literacy support for their families to benefit communities.

b. What are the activities and services that will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Workshops to introduce adolescents to the teaching profession, workshop that bring adolescents (middle and high school students) from inner-city schools in Orlando to UCF to participate in technology-enhanced learning activities and introduce them to the college environment, address questions, prepare them for applying for college, and so on; present a conference on Urban Teaching and Learning for area educators (teachers, school administrators, university faculty, parents students.)

c. What are the direct services to be provided to citizens by the appropriations project?

School workshops on UCF campus; introduction to teaching as a career for students living in poverty (high needs communities); transportation to and from workshops; school supplies and UCF identity attire for those adolescents participating in the Urban Teaching Initiative; national program affiliation for adolescents and for teachers to encourage participation in pre-service and in-service teaching activities.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Economically disadvantaged persons, at-risk youth, homeless, grade school students, high school students, university/college students teachers who work in high poverty middle and high schools in Orange County, and parents in high poverty. 401-800 individuals are expected to be served.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Increase the percentage of students who live in poverty who graduate from high schools prepared to enter college/university to start teacher preparation programs; increase the percentage of teachers hired to work in inner-city schools in Orange County; increase retention of practicing teachers beyond 5 years of service. The medof for measuring the level of benefit would be to annually track the number of high school graduates in inner-city schools in Orlando who become teachers in Title I/high-need schools within 6 years of high school graduation. Track percentage of teachers who are retained in inner-city schools in Orlando after participating in the program.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for in the contract?

The program will be canceled, and all program activities will be canceled.
