a. What is the specific purpose or goal that will be achieved by the funds requested?

Communities In Schools has proven track record over decades of improving attendance, behavior, academic performance, promotion and graduation of at-risk and Title I students by providing integrated student supports (wraparound services). The funds will allow local CIS affiliates to strengthen services in existing schools and expand into new schools, allowing CIS services to reach over 35,000 additional students at 43 school sites. Data on behavior, attendance and academic performance will tracked and reported to school districts and the Florida Department of Education.

b. What are the activities and services that will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Services and strategies include, but are not limited to mentoring, tutoring, identifying and coordinating health services, parent engagement activities, after-school programs, clothes closets, food banks and weekend backpack programs, school supplies, teen-pregnancy programs, drug prevention programs, career readiness and exploration, college readiness and campus visits, and life skills that include time and financial management.

c. What are the direct services to be provided to citizens by the appropriations project?

Services include, but are not limited to mentoring, tutoring, identifying and coordinating health services, parent engagement activities, after-school programs, clothes closets, food banks and weekend backpack programs, school supplies, teen-pregnancy programs, drug prevention programs, career readiness and exploration, college readiness and campus visits, and life skills that include time and financial management.

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d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target population is at-risk youth and economically disadvantaged persons. With this investment we expect to serve 35,000 additional students.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Communities In Schools has its own data management system in which it tracks and maintains regular data on the students we serve. Attendance, behavior, and academic performance, as well as graduation and promotional rates, will be tracked on those students receiving the most intensive services.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for in the contract?

The Florida Department of Education requires contracts that reimburse contractors, in this case CIS, for documented expenses achieving contract deliverables. If deliverables are not met or are inadequately documented, then no state funds will be disbursed to reimburse contractor expenses on the project.
