11. Program Performance:

a. What is the specific purpose or goal that will be achieved by the funds requested?

This request will fund program development and tuition assistance to support an initial master's level cohort of 20 students enrolled in a MS in Women's Health and Midwifery program at the Ft Lauderdale campus. That would be unique to the State of Florida. These professionals will be trained at providing the necessary support for specific women's health issues, especially pregnant women and those considered at risk. This support is critical in providing care to those who may not have access.

b. What are the activities and services that will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Education and training of students that will become Masters level Nurse Practitioners and their training will be especially critical in providing effective prenatal care to those that otherwise may not have been aware of services available and how to qualify.

c. What are the direct services to be provided to citizens by the appropriations project?

The impact of such a program in the community can increase access and drive down medical costs all the while bringing down maternal and infant mortality.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The Florida Department of Health, Division of Public Health Statistics & Performance Management lists 223,579 live birth in Florida in 2017 and of this number 34% are in South Florida. The impact of such a program in the community provides valuable support and can contribute to the decrease of maternal or infant deaths. According to the Florida Pregnancy Associate Mortality review 55.3% of maternal deaths in Florida in 2015 were preventable. This can help drive down costs for prenatal care

Along with the organizations listed above, the American Congress of Obstetricians and Gynecologists, every year in the United States, one million mothers do not receive adequate prenatal care and the need for primary care physicians is growing and only expected to be worse by 2020. There are approximately 38 advance degree nurse midwife programs in the country, but none in the State of Florida. Building of a Master's level program in Women's Health and Midwifery can lead to decrease in maternal and infant deaths. The project will be measured by students graduated, employment gained by those students in hospitals, outpatient and other healthcare offices.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for in the contract?

None--the funds are primarily for initial program development of the MS in Women's Health & Midwifery. The institution will continue to fund the program after one year of initial costs.
